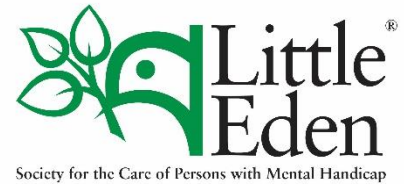


Harvesters of Jesus
